

IREX/ASSISTANCE TO RUSSIAN ORPHANS (ARO) PROGRAM



Expert Committee Meetings in Tomsk

On August 1-3, the ARO Expert Committee met in Tomsk to review grant applications for the conduction of social projects as part of the "Children of the Tomsk Oblast" Program. Organized in cooperation with the Tomsk Department of Family and Children's Issues, the tender called for projects in three key areas of interest: support services for families with children with disabilities, social and psychological support for foster families, and Early Intervention services for children with developmental delays and their families. Ultimately, 17 projects were selected and will each receive 100,000 rubles (approx. \$4,000) per project from the Tomsk Department of Family and Children's Services' budget.

The ARO Expert Committee also reviewed applications for social projects in Tomsk using a consolidated budget. The tender called for social projects for the development of standards of practice for child abandonment prevention services. Of the 24 projects selected for funding, ARO will provide 1,112,000 rubles (approx. \$43,600) to support 13 projects, and 1,276,000 rubles (approx. \$50,000) will be provided by the Department of Family and Children's Issues to finance 11 projects. In addition, the company Vostokgazprom provided 700,000 rubles (approx. \$27,400) in financing for the projects.

Educational Seminar in Novosibirsk

ARO Expert Consultant Ekaterina Selenina conducted a seminar on August 16-17 entitled "Social and Psychological Adaptation of Orphanage Graduates" for 20 specialists, including social workers, guidance counselors, psychologists, and child welfare administrators in the Leninskiy neighborhood of Novosibirsk.

Summary:

In early August, the ARO Expert Committee met in Tomsk to review applications to conduct social projects in the region. A total of 41 projects were selected to provide services to children and families in crisis and develop standards of practice for social services.

The ARO Program conducted multiple educational activities in August, including trainings and seminars in Novosibirsk and Tomsk. ARO also organized a study tour to Tomsk for specialists from Novosibirsk interested in implementing recreational activities for at-risk children.

ARO consultants met with the Head of the Children's Rights Department of the Tambov Oblast Department of Education Marina Bykova in August to discuss Tambov's legislation on guardianship and trusteeship to encourage the promotion of family forms of care for abandoned and orphaned children.

Representatives of the ARO Program took part in two large-scale conferences devoted to a review of the education system in Khabarovsk, and the AROdeveloped after-school activity programs in Khabarovsk, in particular. The mayor of Khabarovsk reaffirmed his support of child abandonment prevention work in schools, as well as family forms of care.



The participants studied the psychological features particular to youth raised in orphanages and innovative methods employed to successfully integrate these young people into society upon their departure from state institutionalized care. The specialists will use the information garnered at the seminar to improve their projects for youth aging out of the orphanage system.

Tambov Guardianship Consultation

On August 21-22, Head of the Tomsk Department of Family and Children's Issues Lyubov Morozova and ARO Expert Consultant Evgeniy Tsymbal traveled to Tambov to meet with the Head of the Children's Rights Department of the Tambov Oblast Department of Education Marina Bykova to discuss the law entitled "On Guardianship and Trusteeship of the Tambov Oblast," which is currently under review.

Over the course of the consultation Marina Bykova received in-depth information on the Tomsk child abandonment prevention model implemented under the auspices of the ARO Program, different examples of regional laws on guardianship and trusteeship, as well as expert feedback on the "On Guardianship and Trusteeship of the Tambov Oblast" law as it currently stands. Marina Bykova will use this information to guide her in her decisions as the Tambov Oblast works with ARO to revamp its child welfare system and guardianship laws.

Khabarovsk City Education Conference

On August 23-24 in the Far Eastern city of Khabarovsk, ARO Representative Natalya Novak took part in a conference entitled "Overall Results of the City Education System for 2006-2007 and the Primary Tasks for the 2007-2008 Academic Year in Khabarovsk City." Organized by Khabarovsk Deputy Mayor Svetlana Shevchenko, the conference brought together 378 school directors, city district heads, city social welfare managers, and specialists from various departments of the city administration to conduct a review of the education system in Khabarovsk.

In light of the mayor's decision in 2005 to implement ARO-developed after-school activity programs for atrisk children throughout the city education system, the achievements of programs for children and families in crisis were closely examined during the conference. In addition, the participants discussed the creation of support services for families caring for abandoned and orphaned children.

During his introduction the mayor of Khabarovsk stressed his support of family-based forms of care for abandoned children and expressed his readiness to continue providing budgetary support for child abandonment prevention services in the framework of the Khabarovsk city education system.

ARO Study Tour to Tomsk

On August 24, four representatives from the Leninskiy neighborhood of Novosibirsk traveled to the Siberian city of Tomsk to learn more about recreational activities for children at risk of child abandonment provided at the *Tomsk Hobby Center* and *Kristall NGO*.

The Deputy Head of Social Issues of the Leninskiy Neighborhood, the Deputy Head of the Leninskiy Social Support Department, the Deputy Director of *Metallurg's* Cultural and Public Work, and a private business owner spoke with specialists at the two Tomsk organizations regarding the implementation of multidisciplinary, after-school activities aimed at the social adaptation of at-risk youth.

Following the tour, the Novosibirsk representatives worked to restructure their project, which will provide similar after-school services for at-risk children at the *Metallurg House of Culture* in the framework of ARO. The participants also discussed other possible locations for recreational activity programs, as well as potential sponsors to support the services in Novosibirsk.

Khabarovsk Krai Education Conference

ARO Representative Natalya Novak attended a conference conducted by the Chairmen of the Khabarovsk Krai Administration O. Lekhovetserom on August 27-28 in Khabarovsk. The conference, entitled "Systemic Effects of the National 'Education' Project in the Khabarovsk Krai," attracted 450 participants from throughout the region, including administration managers, directors from municipal departments of education, and department of education heads. The participants discussed the results of the "Education" project for the 2006-2007 and determined the priorities for the upcoming academic year.



Tomsk Child Welfare Workshop

IREX Educational Consultant Dr. Eileen Lally and Head of the ARO Expert Consulting Group Antonina Shepina traveled to Tomsk to conduct the third in a series of workshops devoted to child welfare issues for the *New Development Charity Foundation* on August 28-31. Sixteen specialists participated in the workshop, which focused on Trainingof-Trainers and supervision of specialists. The Tomsk-based specialists are working to provide introductory training to new specialists in other regions on basic caseworker skills in family-centered work, case management, and early intervention. As always, the participants were extremely receptive to the information presented and learned a lot from each other over the course of the workshop.
